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TEAM AND COACH RESPONSIBILITIES

The following information highlights specific SnVYSA team responsibilities. The HEAD COACH is the SnVYSA team liaison and thereby assumes the responsibility of ensuring that the team meets its obligations.

- ◆ Each team must have an assigned Head Coach and at least one Assistant Coach
- ◆ Each team must have a Team Contact/Mgr. The Head Coach can be the Team Contact.
- ◆ Each team must have a Team Referee
- ◆ Each team is responsible for certain administrative functions

All applicants agree to...

- Read and comply with the WSYSA and SnVYSA Coaches' Code of Conduct, all applicable rules and policies. This information is available at the state web site www.wsysa.com and for SnVYSA at www.snvyasa.org under the Information tab.

Coaches and Assistants agree to...

- Read and understand the SnVYSA Sportsmanship Program, encourage these ideals through positive reinforcement with players and parents. (www.snvyasa.org under the Referee tab)
- Read and understand the SnVYSA Referee Warning Program guidelines and penalties. (www.snvyasa.org)
- Manage sideline behavior in accordance with the standards established by FIFA, USYSA, WSYSA and SnVYSA Code of Conduct.
- Coach the players in a fair, sportsmanlike and conscientious manner.
- Respect the referees and their authority.

Head Coach is responsible to...

- Notify SnVYSA, in writing, of the name of Team Referee who will officiate 5-10 SnVYSA fall games (relative to team age) and have the referee complete an application and submit it to SnVYSA. (Failure to provide a Team Referee may increase the chance that your team's home games will not have an assigned referee.)
- Notify SnVYSA, in writing, of the names of all Assistant Coaches, Team Contacts, Managers, Trainers or anyone who will spend time with the players relative to WSYSA and SnVYSA soccer activities, and have them complete an application and submit it to SnVYSA.
- Attend all coaches' meetings or ensure that a team representative attends in your absence.
- Maintain a current Medical Release Form for each player. The Coach must keep these forms and have them available at all WSYSA or SnVYSA practices, games and activities.
- Maintain a current SnVYSA team roster to include all coaches, team contact, manager, referee and players. Keep this team roster with the team at all times. WSYSA or SnVYSA officials are authorized to request roster verification at any time.

WILL A REFEREE SHORTAGE AFFECT YOUR TEAM?

We will make every effort to provide a referee for all regularly scheduled games (U9 and above), but we cannot guarantee coverage. SnVYSA is not responsible for any consequences, monetarily or otherwise, which may result from the absence of a referee to officiate a game. With your team's assistance, you can help reduce this shortage by recruiting a referee candidate. Your assistance and support is essential in order to resolve this area of concern.
